Every January, we offer training to prospective authors on how to submit an article to the UFJUR, including author guidelines and navigating the online system. The submission is open to all current UF undergraduate students, in any major, who work with a faculty mentor. The submission opens in mid-March and closes April 1 of each year. JUR is a double-blind peer reviewed, open access publication. Students retain copyright through Creative Commons licensing. Each article has a unique DOI and we encourage the student authors, faculty mentors, and colleges to support these student authors by announcing their publication via social media.
