Through her research, excavations, and writings, Wilma B. Williams became the most widely published and recognized authority on the archaeology of Broward County. Among her many accomplishments, she was a founder of the Broward Archaeological Society and a former president of the Florida Anthropological Society. A resident of Hollywood since 1933, Mrs. Williams served as a Broward County Historical Commissioner from 1976 to 1982.
