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Profile and Economic Impacts of Agriculture and Natural Resource Industries in the Northeast Region of Florida

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Executive Summary

This report provides a profile of agricultural and natural resource industries and an overview of their economic impacts for a 21-county region in northeast Florida based on data from the IMPLAN Pro database for Florida counties for 2002 and data from the 2002 Census of Agriculture. Descriptive data include farm characteristics (number, distribution, farm land use, and investment in land and buildings), value of agricultural products and measures of economic impacts such as output, value-added, and employment. Where possible, changes during the 1997-2002 time period are highlighted. Additional reports are available for other major regions of Florida.

In 2002, the northeast region of Florida had more than 12,500 farms and close to 2 million acres of farmland with an estimated asset value of land and buildings exceeding \$5.3 billion. Beef and cattle ranching and farming dominated the farm numbers in the region, while all types of pasture constituted 59 percent of farmland (about 1.2 million acres). Major areas of agricultural activities in the northeast region of Florida included livestock, poultry, milk, and dairy products; nursery, greenhouse, and sod; and vegetables, melons, and potatoes. The market value of agricultural products sold in the northeast region of Florida exceeded \$939 million in 2002, where the value of all livestock, including poultry and their products, constituted the highest portion, with \$538 million, or 58 percent of the region total. Net farm cash income from farm operations exceeded \$158 million for all farms in the region for the same period. Marion County had the highest farm numbers, farm acreage, and estimated asset value of land and buildings, while Suwannee County had the highest value of all agricultural products sold in the northeast region of Florida. Changes in the region during the 1997-2002 period included an 8 percent decrease in the number of farms and a 12 percent decrease in cropland acreage. However, the market value of all agricultural products sold increased by 13 percent between the two census periods. While the value of all livestock and their products increased by 18 percent, the value of poultry and eggs decreased by 19 percent during the 1997-2002 period.

The total economic impacts for all agriculture and natural resource industries in the northeast region of Florida exceeded \$12 billion in output in 2002. The forestry and related wood and paper products industry was the largest sector, contributing more than \$4 billion in total output impacts and accounting for one third of the total in the region. More than 103,000 full- and part-time jobs were generated by agricultural and natural resource industries in the region. Forestry, wood and paper products (the dominant industry group) produced more than 26,000 jobs and accounted for over 26 percent of total employment impacts for all industry groups in the region. The total value-added impacts of agricultural and natural resource industries exceeded \$5.8 billion in 2002. Once again, the forestry, wood and paper products industry with \$1.7 billion in value-added impacts accounted for more than 28 percent of the total value-added impacts (the highest for the region). In terms of economic impacts, Duval County had the highest output impacts, employment impacts, and value-added impacts in the northeast region of Florida.

Introduction

This report provides a profile of agriculture and natural resource industries and an overview of their economic impacts for a 21-county region in northeastern Florida (Figure 1). Additional reports provide similar information for the central, northwest, south, and Suwannee River Basin areas of the state. The report is based on data from the IMPLAN Pro database for Florida counties for 2002 and data from the 2002 Census of Agriculture.¹

The IMPLAN Pro Economic Impact and Social Accounting software package, licensed to the University of Florida by the Minnesota IMPLAN Group, Inc., was used to generate multipliers for output, employment, and value-added for each agricultural and natural resource sector of the regional economy to allow a more comprehensive assessment of impacts. In addition to direct sales of the industries in question, IMPLAN multipliers capture inter-industry purchases (indirect effects) and employee household spending (induced effects). Regional IMPLAN models were constructed for each county using the county-level database provided with the IMPLAN software. No attempt was made to adjust for particular local conditions, and the analysis focused only on economic impacts resulting from operating revenues and employment created by agricultural and natural resource industries.

Data from the 2002 Census of Agriculture² were used to augment the economic impact analysis and to allow for a detailed description of agricultural and natural resource industries for counties in the region. The 2002 Census of Agriculture, conducted by the National Agricultural Statistics Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, provides information at the county level on farm numbers; land use; operator characteristics; the market values of land, buildings, and machinery; crop and livestock sales; farm expenses; and income from federal programs.

Farm Characteristics by County

Farm Numbers (North American Industry Classification System)

There were more than 12,500 farms in the northeast region of Florida in 2002, accounting for 28 percent of all farms in the state (Table 1). Beef and cattle ranching and farming constituted the largest number of farms (4904), or more than 39 percent of all farms in this region. Animal aquaculture and other animal production ranked second (3,571 farms, or 28.5 percent of the regional total), while greenhouse, nursery, and floriculture ranked third (948 farms, or 7.5 percent of the regional total). The northeast region had only a few tobacco farms and only two cotton farms. Marion County with 2,930 farms had the highest farm numbers in the northeast region (23 percent of all farms in the region). Alachua, Suwannee, and Volusia Counties each had more than 1,000 farms.

Farm numbers noted are based on the definition of a farm used by the 2002 Census of Agriculture: "any place from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were produced and sold, or normally would have been sold, during the census year." This definition was first used for the 1974 Census of Agriculture and has remained consistent since so that data are comparable across time periods.

Farm Size Distribution and Investment in Land, Buildings, and Machinery

The northeast region had more than 1, 926,000 acres of land in farms, accounting for 19 percent of total farming acreage for Florida (Table 2). Within the region, Marion County had the largest farm acreage (more than 270,000 acres, or 14 percent of all farmland in the region), followed by Alachua County (more than 222,000 acres, or 12 percent of the regional total). The largest average farm size was in Flagler County (686 acres per farm), followed by Taylor County (532 acres per farm). An average farm size of less than 100 acres was reported for Baker, Duval, Marion, and Volusia Counties.

The estimated asset value of land and buildings for farms in the northeast region was close to \$5.3 billion, accounting for 18 percent of the total value for all of Florida and for an average value of over \$468,000 per farm in the region. Across the region, Marion County had the highest value for land and buildings (\$1,299 million), while Alachua County had the second highest total (\$726 million). The average value of land and building per farm ranged from slightly more that \$267,000 in Bradford County upwards to more than \$1.0 million in Flagler County

For the region as a whole, the total number of farms decreased by 8 percent, total farm acreage decreased by 5 percent, and total asset values increased by 24 percent during the 1997-2002 period. Not all counties, however, followed the regional patterns of change. The number of farms reported in Marion County increased by 24 percent between the two census periods, and smaller percentage increases in farm numbers were reported in Alachua, Clay and St. Johns Counties. Farm numbers remained unchanged in Gilchrist County and decreased in all other counties in the region. The number of farms reported in Taylor County decreased by 39 percent between the two census periods, and farm numbers in several counties decreased by more than 10 percent.

Farm numbers, however, do not always tell the entire story relative to changes in agriculture at the county level. The rather dramatic increase of 24 percent in the number of farms in Marion County (1997-2002) is a case in point. The actual census data (not reported but summarized in Table 2) show an increase of 560 farms in Marion County from 2,370 in 1997 to 2,930 in 2002. Average farm size decreased over the same period (from 119 to 92 acres per farm), and the total amount of land in farms also decreased. The increase in farm numbers (578 farms) came primarily in the farm groups in the 1-9 acres category (152 farms) and the 10-49 acres category (426 farms). There was a smaller increase in farms in the 500-1999 acres category (15 farms). All other size categories reflected decreased farm numbers between the census periods, including the largest farm size category reported (2000 acres or more) which decreased by 5 farms. Rather than changes in agriculture, it is more likely that farm numbers in Marion County reflect the popularity of "ranchette" type development associated with population growth in the county. The result is an increase in the number of farms from dividing farmland into smaller parcels.

For the region as a whole, the estimated value of farm investments in land and buildings increased by 24 percent between 1997 and 2002. Across the region, 12 counties had percentage increases in value of land and buildings that exceeded the average increase for the region. Alachua County had the highest increase (67 percent) in the estimated asset value of land and buildings, while the total value of land and buildings decreased in 6 counties.

The reported farm acreage increased for Baker County by 19 percent (the largest increase), and farm acreage reported in St. Johns County decreased by 26 percent (the largest decrease). Five other counties reported increases in farm acreage, while decreases were reported for 12 counties across the region. As noted earlier, the net effect at the regional level was a modest decrease in reported farm acreage over the 1997-2002 period.

Farmland Use




Figure 2. Land use in the northeast region of Florida by acres and percent of total

Agricultural lands in the northeast region of Florida were used mainly for cropland, nursery, greenhouse, floriculture, pasture, rangeland, and woodland. There were more than 580,000 acres used as cropland in the region in 2002. Harvested cropland constituted only half of the total cropland (Figure 2). Nursery, greenhouse, and floriculture included more than 128 million square feet under glass or other protection plus 18,000 acres in the open. More than 1.1 million acres were used for all types of pasture, and there were about 720,000 acres in farm woodland, with 57 percent of it used as pasture. Land enrolled in conservation or Wetlands Reserve Programs and federal or other crop insurance programs represented less than 53,000 acres out of a total of more than 580,000 acres (Tables 3A & 3B).

For cropland, Marion and Alachua Counties, each with more than 80,000 acres of cropland, ranked first and second, followed by Levy and Suwannee Counties with 69,000 and 68,000 acres of cropland, respectively. For harvested cropland, Suwannee County ranked first in the region, with over 40,000 acres, followed by Alachua and Levy Counties, each with more than 39,000 acres. Alachua, Marion and Levy were the leading counties for land used for pasture.

Volusia was by far the largest county for nursery, greenhouse, and floriculture production, with more than 105 million square feet under glass or other protection (82 percent of the region total) and over 5,000 acres in the open (30 percent of the region total) in 2002. Putnam County ranked second in nursery, greenhouse, and floriculture under glass or other protection, with 19 million square feet, in 2002. Levy County had more than 2,800 acres of nursery, greenhouse, and floriculture in the open (15 percent of all in the northeast region).

For the northeast region as a whole, the reported cropland acreage decreased by 12 percent, and pastureland and rangeland acreage increased by 20 percent during the 1997-2002 period. There was, however, significant variation across the region. Reported cropland acreage in 12 counties decreased by a larger percentage than the average decrease for the region, with 10 counties reflecting a decrease of more than 20 percent. Reported cropland acreage increased in 8 counties. Significant increases in cropland acreage were reported for Alachua, Bradford, Dixie, and Union Counties.

Market Value of Agricultural Products Sold, Production Expenses, and Net Farm Cash Income from Operation

Table 4 reports the market value of agricultural products sold in the northeast region of Florida. According to the 2002 Census of Agriculture, "market value of agricultural products sold represents the gross market value before taxes and production expenses of all agricultural products sold or removed from the place in 2002 regardless of who received the payment." The value is equivalent to total sales, including the value of any shares received by partners, landlords, contractors, or others associated with the operation, and the value of commodities placed in Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loans. The market value of agricultural products sold does not include payments received for participation in other federal farm programs nor income from farm-related sources such as custom-work, other agricultural services, or income from non-farm sources.

The market value of agricultural products sold in the northeast region of Florida exceeded \$939 million in 2002 (Table 4), for an average value of more than \$103,000 per farm. St. Johns County with more than \$292,000 and Marion County with about \$30,000 per farm market value of all agricultural products sold registered the highest and the lowest value, respectively. Total farm production expenses exceeded \$832 million for an average of \$85,852 per farm. Net farm cash income from operations in 2002 exceeded \$158 million for all farms in the region. Net farm cash income from operations was negative for Duval, Gilchrist, and Marion Counties. Across the region, market values of products sold increased by 13 percent between the two census periods, but decreases in total market values were reported in 12 of the 21 counties in the region. Net farm cash incomes reflected decreases in only 3 counties.

Suwannee County registered the highest market value of agricultural products sold in the northeast region, with close to \$136 million (14 percent of region total), and it also had the highest net farm cash income from operations of \$41 million (26 percent). Volusia County was second behind Suwannee in market value of agricultural products sold and second in the net farm cash income from operations.

Value of Agricultural Products by Commodity Group




Figure 3. Market value of agricultural products sold in 2002 by commodity group in northeast region of Florida

For the northeast region, the value of poultry, other livestock, and their products constituted the highest portion of the market value of agricultural products in 2002, amounting to more than \$536 million, or 58 percent of the regional total (Table 5). The value of nursery, greenhouse, floriculture, and sod ranked second with about \$202 million, or 22 percent of the regional total (Figure 3). The value of vegetables, melons, potatoes, and sweet potatoes ranked third with almost \$110 million, or 12 percent. The value of livestock, poultry, and their products in Suwannee County exceeded \$103 million (19 percent of the region). Volusia County had the highest value for nursery, greenhouse, floriculture, and sod products, with more than \$95 million, or 47 percent of regional total.

Trends during 1997-2002 showed an 18 percent increase in the value of livestock, poultry, and their products for the region. Within this broader group, the value of poultry decreased by 19 percent, while cattle and calves' increased by 10 percent. When compared to other commodity groups, fruits, tree nuts, and berries represent a smaller total value (\$13.7 million), but their value more than doubled during 1997-2002. The value of fruits, tree nuts, and berries almost tripled in Alachua County during this period.

Principal Operator, Business Organization and Ethnicity

In 2002, there were over 18,000 farm operators in the northeast region (35 percent were women). Farming was indicated as the primary occupation by 53 percent of all farm operators (Table 6). Marion County had over 4,000 farm operators, or 24 percent (the highest number of farm operators in the northeast region), and the highest number of women operators in northeast region.

Trends during 1997-2002 showed that the number of farmers who reported farming as primary occupation in the northeast region increased by 29 percent. During the same time period, the number of farms with farming as the primary occupation in Levy and Marion Counties increased by 88 and 71 percent, respectively.




Figure 4. Farm acreage percentages by type of business organization in northeast region of Florida

With respect to the type of business organization, most farms (90 percent) in the northeast region were family and individual types of businesses (Table 7). Partnership farms, corporate farms (family or other than family held), cooperatives, estates or trusts, and institutional farms together comprised only 10 percent of the total number of farms. Family and individual farms exceeded 1 million acres and accounted for 68 percent of all farm acreage in the northeast region (Figure 4). Corporate farm acreage was about 19 percent of total farm acreage; however, most of the corporate farms were family held corporations.

The white ethnic group operated most of the farms in the northeast region. Other ethnic groups identified as farm operators included Black or African American, Spanish, Hispanic or Latino Origin, American Indian, Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian, other Pacific Islander, and Asian. Whites accounted for 92 percent of all farm operators and operated 95 percent of all farm acreage in the region (Table 8). Some counties reported only the white ethnic group as farm operators. Marion and Alachua Counties had the highest number of minority ethnic group farms, farm operators and acreage.

Economic Impact Results

As noted earlier, the IMPLAN software package and associated databases allow the estimation of multipliers to capture the total economic impact of agricultural and natural resource industries within a regional or local economy. This section reports the results of impact estimations for counties in the northeast region for each of the agricultural sectors within IMPLAN. Again estimates are based only on the IMPLAN data set with no attempt to adjust for particular local situations and the focus is only on impacts of sales and expenditures associated with farm operations and related manufacturing.³

For each reported measure (output, value-added and employment) for each county, the impacts reported include the direct output of the agricultural sector in question, the impacts associated with indirect inter-industry purchases of inputs by agriculture and its supplying industries, and the induced impacts of spending by employees and owners of agricultural and supplying industries.

Reported impacts include activities within production agriculture, natural resource industry (forestry, mining and fishing), food and forest products manufacturing, agricultural input supply, and agricultural services. Impacts are reported in terms of labor income and indirect business taxes.

Output Impacts

Table 9 presents estimates of output impacts for agriculture and natural resource industries by sector and by county for the northeast region of Florida. The total output impacts for all counties in the region exceeded \$12 billion. The forestry and related wood and paper products industry was the largest sector, contributing more than \$4 billion in total output impacts and accounting for one third of the total in the region. The other food product manufacturing industry with \$2.9 billion in output impacts was the next largest group in the region. The livestock and dairy farming and animal products industry was also a large sector, with more than \$1.5 billion in total output impacts. Agricultural inputs and services as well as environmental horticulture (greenhouse/nursery production and landscape services), each with a total output impact close to \$1.0 billion, were also major contributors to the impact of agriculture and natural resource industries in the region

In terms of total impact, Duval was the largest county, with more than \$5 billion in output impacts, and Taylor County with \$941 million had the second largest output impacts in the region. The other food product manufacturing group in Duval County, with \$2,735 million, accounted for 95 percent of total output impacts for this group in the region and half of the total output impacts for Duval County. Marion County had the highest output impacts in the fruit and vegetable farming and processing group, with a total of \$157 million. Suwannee County with more than \$587 million in the output impact of livestock, dairy farming and animal products industry registered the highest output impact for this industry group in the northeast region. Duval and Volusia Counties had the largest output impacts for the environmental horticultural industry.

Employment Impacts




Figure 5. Employment impacts by industry group and the number of jobs in northeast region of Florida

Employment impacts of agriculture and natural resource industries by county and industry group are reported in Table 10. More than 103,000 full- and part-time jobs are generated by agricultural and natural resource industries in the northeast region of Florida. Forestry and wood and paper products manufacturing (the dominant industry group) produced more than 26,000 jobs and accounted for over 26 percent of total employment impacts for all industry groups in the region. Environmental horticulture (greenhouse/nursery production and landscape services) and other food product manufacturing each produced an employment impact of more than 18,000 jobs. These three industry groups accounted for 61 percent of all employment impact in the region. The livestock, dairy farming and animal products industry group produced about 13,000 jobs (Figure 5).

Duval County dominated most sectors of the agriculture and natural resource industries, and with more than 43,000 jobs, it accounted for 42 percent of all employment impacts in the northeast region. Volusia County (7,600 jobs) was second and Marion County (6,100 jobs) was third in the number of jobs produced in the region. Marion County produced more than 1,500 jobs based on fruit and vegetable farming and processing (the highest number in the northeast region). Suwannee County produced more than 4,000 jobs in the livestock, dairy farming and animal products industry (the highest for this group in the region).

Value-added Impacts




Figure 6. Value-added impacts by industry group in northeast region of Florida

Value-added is the market value of a firm's output <u>less</u> the value of the inputs which it has purchased from others. It can be viewed as a net economic contribution by the industry sector after direct costs have been subtracted from gross sales. Value-added is the difference between the value of goods as they leave a particular stage of production and the costs of the goods as they entered that stage. Value-added includes payments made by industries to workers, interest, profits, and indirect business taxes. Total value-added impacts of agriculture and natural resource industries in the northeast region exceeded \$5.8 billion (Table 11). Forestry, wood, and paper products with \$1.7 billion in value-added impacts accounted for over 28 percent of the total value-added impacts for the region. The other food manufacturing industry with \$1.5 billion was also a major contributor. Environmental horticulture generated value-added impacts of more than \$600 million (Figure 6).

Duval County with \$2.9 billion, accounted for more than half of the value-added impacts for all counties in the region. Duval County's dominant position was obvious in most sectors of the agricultural and natural resource industries. Almost half of the total value-added impacts in Duval County came from the other food manufacturing sector. Volusia County with \$206 million in value-added impacts in environmental horticulture topped Duval County in this group and registered the second highest value-added impacts in the region, with \$342 million.

Labor Income Impacts

Labor income impacts totaled over \$3.6 billion (Tables 12). More than 30 percent of the total labor income impact was due to the activities in the area of forestry, wood, and paper products (\$1,114 million). Other major contributors included other food product manufacturing with \$842 million, environmental horticulture with \$461 million, and agricultural input and services with \$359 million.

For labor income impacts Duval County was the largest, with more than \$1,760 million, or 48 percent of the total labor income impacts for the region. Volusia County's \$126 million in labor income impacts in environmental horticulture came in second to Duval County's \$158 million.

Indirect Business Tax Impacts

Indirect business taxes consist of excise taxes, property taxes, fees, licenses, and sales taxes paid by businesses. These taxes occur during the normal operation of businesses but do not include taxes on profit or income. Total indirect business tax impacts were more than \$447 million for the region (Table13). Unlike the other economic performance measures, the other food manufacturing industry (\$227 million) indirect business tax impacts topped the same value for the forestry, wood, and paper product industry (\$90 million). Duval County with over \$289 million (over 64 percent) dominated the northeast region and across industry groups on indirect business tax impacts in the northeast region, followed by Marion County with \$17.7 million.
