

4-H Horse and Pony Lease¹

Introduction

In the Florida 4-H Horse Lease Program, the same animal may be leased by up to three 4-H members and all Lessees must conform to the requirements of the Florida 4-H Equine Program. Refer to the current year "Florida 4-H Area & State Horse Shows Official Rules" for current rules regarding leasing a horse. Also in the current rulebook are the class entry rules for sharing a horse in the Area and State 4-H Horse shows.

This lease form is to be used as an agreement between one Lessee and the Horse owner. If other Lessees are sharing the Horse, they must each complete a separate lease form.

This lease form was designed to cover the basic agreement between a 4-H member and a horse owner. If either party prefers to delete or edit any of the wording, or add more wording, it may be done as long as both parties agree and it does not alter any lease rules required by 4-H. Members of the general public leasing the same Horse as a 4-H youth are not required to use this particular form. However, anyone involved in a horse lease is encouraged to have similar agreements spelled out in writing.

This document contains the forms that might be needed for one 4-H'er to lease a horse: a page of instructions, a page of advice, the 3-page lease form, and 2 copies of the addendum (if up to two others are sharing Horse).

A Lease Agreement is between the Lessor and Lessee—UF/IFAS, and 4-H are not parties in this lease and have no rights or responsibilities in any of its terms. Rules stated regarding leasing are to ensure that a 4-H'er is formally leasing a horse for 4-H project purposes. Any suggestions for completing the lease are given so both parties can enter the agreement with as much information as possible. This publication is not meant as legal advice, nor is it meant to replace counsel from an attorney.


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4-H HORSE AND PONY LEASE

Instructions for Use





In the Florida 4-H Horse Lease Program, the same animal may be leased by up to three 4-H members and all Lessees must conform to the requirements of the Florida 4-H Equine Program. Refer to the current year "Florida 4-H Area & State Horse Shows Official Rules" for current rules regarding leasing a horse. Also in the current rulebook are the class entry rules for sharing a horse in the Area and State 4-H Horse shows.

Basic terms: Once it is defined who is represented by these terms at the beginning of the lease, only the representative term will be used throughout the document.

Lessor: The person who has the authority to grant a lease; usually the horse owner.

Lessee: The person leasing the horse from the Lessor. Could be a 4-H member, or a youth or adult from the

general public.

Horse: All encompassing term for the animal described in the lease form; could be horse, pony, mule, donkey, etc.

This lease form is to be used as an agreement between one Lessee and the Horse owner. If other Lessees are sharing the Horse, they must each complete a separate lease form.

- The Lessee and Lessor should each keep a copy of the Agreement for reference.
- A copy should also be given to the 4-H Agent to file as proof of leasing the Horse for 4-H show eligibility purposes.

If a Horse is being leased to multiple persons, or if anyone will have access to the use of the Horse other than the Lessee named on the 4-H Horse and Pony Lease Agreement, the Lessor must complete an addendum for each person who will be using the Horse.

- The 4-H Program can only define how many 4-H'ers may share a lease on a horse for 4-H shows. However, the 4-H Program cannot limit how many other people from the general public may also lease or use the same horse.
- It is in the best interest of the Lessee to know exactly who else will be using the leased Horse and what everyone's responsibilities and commitments are (for upkeep and use, as well as legal).
- This Addendum simply discloses a summary of the usage agreement that the Horse owner has with each of the other persons using the Horse.
- The addendums do not need to be notarized, nor do copies need to be given to the 4-H Agent. It is just an information disclosure from the Horse owner to the Lessee.

This lease form was designed to cover the basic agreement between a 4-H member and a horse owner. If either party prefers to delete or edit any of the wording, or add more wording, it may be done as long as both parties agree and it does not alter any lease rules required by 4-H. Members of the general public leasing the same Horse as a 4-H youth are not required to use this particular form. However, anyone involved in a horse lease is encouraged to have similar agreements spelled out in writing.

4-H HORSE AND PONY LEASE "Things to Think About" when Completing

Horse leases should help protect the interests of both the youth leasing the Horse and the Horse's owner. To help prevent possible confusion and/or disagreements later, try to think through all the situations that may arise during the length of the lease. Then, include how they will be handled in the written lease. Some examples of questions to address which are not specifically asked in the lease include:

- Will you be required to take a minimum number of lessons? Or expected to meet a certain level of proficiency before being allowed to take the Horse to a show?
- If you qualify for the State 4-H Horse Show, will you be allowed to take the Horse to Tampa for 3-4 days? If you qualify for Regionals, will you be allowed to travel with the Horse out of state for a week?

If someone else is sharing the leased Horse, it is very important that everyone involved knows who else has access to, and responsibilities for, the Horse. For example, if you are leasing a horse that will be used by others, you will probably want to be clear on details such as:

- Exactly who else might be using this Horse? Is it other 4-H'ers, other adults/youth not in 4-H, clients of the owner taking lessons?
- Do these other people who will be using the Horse have their own lease agreements, or are they using the horse at the owner's discretion?
- How will everyone split riding times during the week?
- How will the Horse be shared at open horse shows? At 4-H horse shows? At the Area & State 4-H horse shows?
- How are the routine maintenance costs split between everyone involved in leases? How will the unexpected veterinary bills be split between the lessees?
- If the Horse is hurt when being used by another lessee, will you be responsible for veterinary bills? What about if it is hurt during routine handling by the owner or someone on his/her staff are the lessees responsible for the veterinary bills?
- If the Horse hurts someone or something when being used by another lessee, will you be liable? What about if it hurts someone or something during routine handling by the owner or someone on his/her staff are the lessees going to be liable?

These are just some of the questions that may arise when you and the Horse owner discuss the parameters of the lease. As the form is completed, really think about and discuss the ramifications of what is being asked in the agreement. Then be sure everything that what was decided in the ensuing discussion is included in writing in the lease agreement.

Note: A Lease Agreement is between the Lessor and Lessee – UF/IFAS/4-H is not a party in any of the terms and responsibilities. Rules stated regarding leasing are to ensure that a 4-H'er is formally leasing a horse for 4-H project purposes. Any suggestions for completing the lease are given so both parties can enter the agreement with as much information as possible. It is not meant as legal advice, nor is it meant to replace counsel from an attorney.

If during the term of this Lease the Horse is in exclusive possession of Lessee, Lessee agrees to take full responsibility for the care of the Horse Lessee's expense. It is understood that the Lessee will follow practices of good animal husbandry in protecting Horse from illness, injury, suffering. This will include all necessary immunizations, other veterinary care, proper and adequate food, water, shelter, and farrier attention. However, in case of illness and/or injury, the Lessee will notify the Lessor and report treatment and progress at reasonable intervals. Lessor sheave the right at any time, in person or by authorized agent, to request permission to go upon the premises where Horse is housed to inspect the Horse and determine if said Horse is being properly cared for and in good health.
Lessee warrants that the Horse has been inspected and agrees to accept said Horse in present condition. If Lessee maintains Horse in a location of the Lessor's property, Lessee shall pay for and provide transportation of the horse from the Lessee to the Lessor at the termination the lease.
The title and ownership of the leased Horse shall be and remain in the name of the Owner/Lessor. Lessee shall not assign this Lease nor sublethe horse covered. The leased Horse shall be turned over to the Lessor in a healthy condition as determined by an agreed upon veterinarian.
If Lessee is in the exclusive possession of the Horse during the Term of the Lease, Lessee will insure the Horse for the sum of \$
Owner/Lessor Signature: Date:
Owner shall not hold Lessee liable for any serious injury or death of the Horse arising from events not resulting from negligence on the part the Lessee. Lessee shall hold the Lessor/Owner harmless for any injury to persons or damages to any property caused by the leased Horse who being used by the Lessee. The Lessee will carry a liability policy specifically on this Horse both for the Lessee's protection and for that of the Lessor.
If Horse is being shared by multiple Lessees, and/or is available for use by non-Lease-bound parties (for example, lessons), and/or remains on toroperty of the Lessor, then responsibilities for damages caused by Horse, injuries caused by Horse, or injuries to Horse during times when Lessnamed on this Lease is absent will be handled as follows:
