1. *DATE AND LOCALE*: August 5-8, 1985; Ocho Rios Sheraton Hotel; Ocho Rios, Jamaica, West Indies.
2. *OFFICIAL TRAVEL AGENCY*: EMMER TRAVEL, INC., 2801 S.W. Archer Road, Gainesville, FL 32608; contact Ms. Lona Stein at (904) 377-1222 (Gainesville residents) or (800) 342-2223 (toll free for Florida residents) or (800) 874-8487 (toll free for USA residents).
3. *REGISTRATION AND PAPER SUBMISSION*: In the attached pages, you will find a form for submission of a paper at the 1985 FES meetings and for pre-registering. Registration fees have been set by the FES at (includes banquet):

4. *HOTEL COSTS*: Rooms in the Ocho Rios Sheraton will be \$168.00 per person for double occupancy and will be \$310.00 per person for rooms occupied singly. All children under 17 years of age will stay free when staying in room with parents. These prices include each of the following:
  - 4 days/3 nights at the Ocho Rios Sheraton
  - free welcome rum swizzle upon arrival at hotel
  - transportation to and from Montego Bay and hotel  
(this is ca. a 1.5 hr drive)
  - access to meeting rooms
  - tips/taxes/porter service at hotel
  - free calypso band upon arrival at hotel
5. *AIR TRANSPORTATION*: Eastern Airlines and Air Jamaica schedule only four daily flights from Miami to Montego Bay; therefore, it's imperative to make reservations as early as possible in order to guarantee a seat. Because of the restricted number of flights and the fact that August is considered "high" season in Jamaica, discount fares are generally not available. EMMER TRAVEL, however, has secured group fares of \$217.00 from Orlando and \$155.00 from Miami to Montego Bay. We are planning to fly out of Orlando as this is a more central location. If interest is high, we may be able to take an Air Jamaica "airbus" non-stop from Orlando to Montego Bay for \$217.00 per person. Which flight you go on and the total price you pay depends upon *HOW SOON* you contact *EMMER TRAVEL, INC.* and book your ticket. As always, prices are not guaranteed, but once you've reserved through Emmer Travel, you'll be guaranteed the lowest applicable fare.
6. *TRANSPORTATION TO ORLANDO*: EMMER TRAVEL, INC. will arrange rental cars or chartered buses upon request. A bus with 46 seats costs approximately \$400.00. This is less than \$10.00 per person each way. This would appear to be less than your cost of driving to Orlando and paying parking fees for one week. EMMER TRAVEL has also secured a flat rate of \$25.00 per day for a rental car to and from

Orlando with no drop off charge. Call EMMER TRAVEL for any group travel arrangements at a discount.

7. *THE PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTED*: To facilitate exchange of ideas with Caribbean scientists, the FES planning committee has organized the following symposia:

- biology and control of coffee pests
- use of pheromones in crops of the Caribbean Basin
- crop protection for small farm systems
- impact, biology, control and quarantine of fruit flies
- behavioral ecology
- biological control
- toxicological problems of developing countries

In addition to these symposia, we will hold the usual student paper contest and sessions for submitted papers. The 1985 meetings will be set up for two concurrent sessions to accommodate all papers and symposia. Each of the above symposia is being organized by a Caribbean or USA scientist who has been given a late-January, 1985 deadline for selecting speakers and allocating time slots. This should enhance our ability to assemble a quality program.

8. *WHAT YOU SHOULD DO*: The following is a checklist of what you should do if you plan to attend the Jamaica meetings:

- a. remove the attached registration form and send it to Dr. Dave Schuster, Program Chairman, AREC Bradenton, 5007 60th Street East, Bradenton, FL 33508; include the registration fee which is appropriate and the proper amount for extra banquet tickets
- b. call Emmer Travel, Inc. at the appropriate number and reserve your hotel room and book your air transportation; also, you can arrange transportation to Orlando or Miami with Emmer; you will pay Emmer Travel, Inc. for *both* your hotel and your air transportation, you will then not have to deal with foreign currency once in Jamaica.
- c. remember that with item "a" above, submit a paper title; if you know you will be in one of the aforementioned symposia, DO NOT submit a paper title; merely state on the form which symposium you will be participating; symposia coordinators will submit complete lists of speakers and titles
- d. when you contact Emmer Travel, Inc., you must specify each of the following:
  - hotel room reservation request (for how many people)
  - whether or not children under 17 will attend
  - airline reservations needed
  - USA ground transportation needed or Rental cars needed in Jamaica
  - how many nights BEFORE OR AFTER THE FES MEETINGS you desire to stay at the hotel

9. *INCIDENTAL INFORMATION*: Please note each of the following, as it may make you more assured about the upcoming meetings:

- a. currently, the exchange rate between the USA and Jamaica is ca. \$1.00 USA = J2.40; since you will pay Emmer Travel, Inc. for your major expenses, you need only worry about your incidentals

- (meals, what you plan to buy there, etc.); you can get currency exchanged right in the hotel.
- b. all major credit cards (for payment of incidentals) will be accepted in the hotel; however, BE WARNED that your credit card company may not recognize the same exchange rate as you will get for cash; this must be checked out by YOU prior to departure with your credit card company
  - c. no PASSPORT or vaccinations are required to USA citizens to enter into Jamaica; however, you are advised to carry your passport if you have it; you must take some form of identification (e.g., a driver's license or birth certificate); Emmer Travel, Inc. can help you clarify this when you call them.
  - d. various tours will be available via the Green Light Transportation Service right out of the Sheraton lobby; we decided to let you pick your own tours once you arrived in Jamaica; representatives from both Green Light and Emmer Travel, Inc. will be available in the hotel to assist you with tour availability and prices; most of you will want to spend the first day or so on the beautiful Ocho Rios beaches.
  - e. Emmer Travel, Inc. will see that a list of passengers, arrival times and flight numbers are provided to the Green Light Transportation Service in Montego Bay; do not fret, someone will be in Montego Bay to shuttle you to Ocho Rios; this is ca. a 1.5 hr. drive along beautiful beaches a long part of the way; you will be registered for the hotel while in route to the hotel; thus, all you will have to do is go straight to your room upon arrival.
  - f. we have planned for a buffet style banquet around the pool; your registration fee (or separate purchase of banquet ticket for guests) admits you to the banquet; one hour prior to the banquet, we will have a *cash bar* mixer around the pool and will be entertained by a roving calypso band
  - g. you should know that your registration fee provides for you:
    - access to the banquet
    - morning coffee/soft drink breaks
