RALPH L. MILLER  
(1902-1985)

Dr. Ralph L. Miller, a retired citrus consultant and research entomologist, died September 18, 1985 in Orlando, Florida.

Dr. Miller served as President of the Florida Entomological Society in 1937.

A graduate of Ohio State University where he received his B.S., M.S. and Ph.D. degrees, Dr. Miller moved to Florida in 1926 and to Orlando in 1929. Some of the positions held by Dr. Miller before he became a private consultant in 1955 were: Florida State Plant Board at Lake Alfred, Chairman of Florida State Plant Board, Associate Entomologist with the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Research Director of Freeport Sulphur Co., Research Director of Florida Agricultural Supply Co., and Research Director at Plymouth Citrus Growers Assn.

He was a member of the Florida Cannery Assn. (President), Citrus Processors Assn. (President), Florida State Horticultural Soc. (Sec.-Treas), Florida Entomological Soc. (President), Florida Citrus Commission—Research Committee, Florida Citrus Mutual—Advisory Committee, Entomological Society of America, and a 50-year member of the American Chemical Society.

Dr. Miller was well known and respected throughout the citrus industry, which he served diligently and caringly throughout his career. He will be missed.

He is survived by his wife, Edna Miller; daughters, Mrs. Phoebe Carpenter, Mrs. Lois Bush; sister, Mrs. Grace Grooms; seven grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
