The Society supports these objectives by promoting acquaintance and discussion among its members and with scholars and practitioners in related fields by stimulating research and field investigation, by encouraging publication of scholarly studies, and by performing services to aid the advancement of its members and the field of geography in Florida.

Since 1996 the Florida Geographical Alliance, whose mission is to support geographical education in K through 12, has paid for the publication and distribution of the *Florida Geographer*. All members of the Alliance receive the journal, and articles related to geographical education are enthusiastically encouraged.

Meetings are held in different parts of the state and always include field trips to allow participants to gain first-hand knowledge through field experience.
