### RESOLUTIONS

#### RESOLUTIONS CONCERNING THE TEACHING DIVISION OF THE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA

*Whereas*, agriculture in general, including citrus and other tree crops, truck and vegetables, farm and field crops, animal husbandry, dairy, poultry, forestry, etc., are of utmost importance to the State of Florida, and

*Whereas*, there has been and will continue to be a great need for the training of young men along these lines, these men being the ones on whom the State must largely depend in future years, and

*Whereas*, the Teaching Division of the College of Agriculture is the institution for training and educating such young men, and

*Whereas*, up to the present time facilities of the Teaching Division have not been sufficient to keep pace with the needs for adequate education of the agricultural youth of Florida, and

*Whereas*, the importance of this training to the State is great in general lines as well as agriculture,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chair name a Committee from the Horticultural Society to call together representatives of other agricultural and horticultural interests in the State with the thought and purpose of all such interests developing and joining together in a plan for building and maintaining the Teaching Division of the College of Agriculture, and on such a basis as it may adequately serve the youth of the State in agricultural instruction; and for the securing of sufficient State funds to make such a program possible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that it is the sense of this resolution that this committee and its co-workers make this a continuing effort with the idea that in a reasonable number of years the above desired results may be accomplished, and further so that all three branches of the College of Agriculture may be maintained in the future on such a basis as will adequately serve the needs of Florida.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee provided for herein be authorized to send copies of this resolution to such other agricultural and horticultural interests in the State as in their judgment it deems best, and that this Committee be instructed to bring in a report with recommendations at the Society's next Annual Meeting.

#### RESOLUTIONS CONCERNING HORTICULTURAL CROP PROTECTION SERVICE

*Whereas*, the State of Florida and the United States Department of Agriculture have jointly

been operating the Federal State Horticultural Crop Protection Service for the past two winters, and

*Whereas*, large benefits from this service have already accrued to fruit and vegetable growers and others, and

*Whereas*, there is great need for the continuance of the service, and expansion of same so as to cover all parts of the State where tender winter crops are grown, and

*Whereas*, additional funds will be necessary for such expansion, and requests have already been made of the Federal Government for their share, and

*Whereas*, it appears necessary and proper for the State of Florida to provide approximately \$8,000.00 additional funds for its share of the expansion of the work.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Florida State Horticultural Society, that the Legislature of the State of Florida is hereby requested to appropriate an additional \$8,000.00 per annum to be added to the present appropriation of \$10,000.00 per annum now going to the general Experiment Station for the State's part in maintaining the Federal State Horticultural Crop Protection Service, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be handed to His Excellency, the Governor of the Great State of Florida, Fred P. Cone, Hon. B. Stuart Gillis, President of the Senate, Hon. J. J. Parrish, Chairman of the Senate Citrus Committee, Hon. Harry Tillman, and copies to Hon. McL. Christie, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and Hon. Dwight L. Rogers, Chairman of the House Citrus Committee, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Committee of the Florida State Horticultural Society be and is hereby instructed to work for securing of the above mentioned funds for purpose indicated.
