PHOTO 100. Beach scarp and mini-landslide on Amagansett Beach, Long Island, New York. This scarp was cut into the berm during a summer storm (August 1983). Degraded at each high tide, the scarp will eventually disappear after several tidal cycles. Undermining at the scarp foot by swash causes slope failure in the form of mini-landslides.
