Lighthouse Beach. **Upper photo:** Lighthouse Beach, New South Wales, is shown in a highly accreted state where the usually detached bar has reached the beach forming six well developed transverse rips and one headland rip in foreground. *Dark Point.* **Lower photo:** Dark Point, New South Wales, is a small attached headland shown here with well developed transverse bar and rip systems to either side. The main beach is backed by a low foredune, deflation basin and 1 km wide dune sheet consisting of transverse dune which are advancing toward the viewer at 5 m per year.
