REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLICATION IN INSECTA MUNDI

Our quarterly journal, Insecta Mundi, is among the very few journals that have no page charges. However, since the Center for Systematic Entomology is entirely financed through dues, subscriptions, and cash donations, we have certain requirements for publication in the journal. (See also information on front inside cover.)

- 1. All authors must be members of the society, this includes each of the authors of articles with more than one author. If foreign authors are unable to pay for membership in U.S.A. dollars, but can purchase separates, the membership may be included in the bill for separates. Other arrangements may be made by application to the Board of Directors. Membership is currently \$15.00 per year and member's subscription is an additional \$20.00.
- 2. Authors are required to purchase 100 separates at \$8.00/page/100 copies (e.g., a two page articles costs \$16.00, 3-page, \$24.00, etc.). We cannot supply less than 100 copies. If additional copies are needed, arrangements will be made for these at additional cost, or we will supply camera-ready pages for the use of the author's printer. Shipping charges for separates is additional. In U.S.A. the shipping charge is: 1-2 pp. \$3.05; 1-4 pp. \$3.48; 1-6 pp. \$3.48; 1-8 pp. \$3.91; 1-10 pp. \$3.91; 1-12 pp. \$4.34; 1-14 pp. \$4.34; 1-16 pp. 4.77; 1-18 pp. \$4.77; 1-20 pp. \$5.20; 1-22 pp. \$5.20; 1-24 pp. 5.63; 1-26 pp. \$5.63; over 26 pages, no additional charge, included in additional pages (see below). Foreign shipping charges: 1-2 pp. \$3.36; 1-4 pp. \$4.32; 1-6 pp. \$4.32; 1-8 pp. \$5.22; 1-10 pp. \$5.22; 1-12 pp. \$6.12; 1-14 pp. \$6.12; 1-16 pp. \$7.02; 1-20 pp. \$7.92; 1-22 pp. \$7.92; 1-24 pp. \$8.82; over 26 pages, no additional charge, included in additional pages (see below).
- 3. For the first 25 pages of an article, there are no page charges. However, to provide for short articles for prompt publication, for articles that run over 25 printed pages, a surcharge of \$35.00 is added for each additional page (e.g., the pages charges for a 26 page article is a total of \$35.00; a 30 page article will have a \$175.00 additional charge, etc.).

4. No additional charge is made for line drawings. However, printers charge \$15.00 per page for the insertions of halftone illustrations, a charge passed on to the authors.

5. Full color pages are possible. These are printed on coated paper (now used in all issues. The color separations cost approximately \$75.00 per page and the additional cost printing increases the cost to not over \$500. per page, less under certain circumstances. Those anticipating using color should write for an exact quote. There is no additional charge for separates of articles with full color.

6. Additional editorial reguirements:

A. We ask that the Museum codens (=acronyms) be used when citing the location ofcollections, preferably as published in: "Insect and Spider Collections of the World" 1993 edition, by R. H. Arnett, Jr., G. A. Samuelson, and G. M. Nishida.

- B. We prefer that all geographical names be spelled out and that place names have the firt letter capitalized, including World, Northeast, etc.
 - C. Spell out: New Species; New Genus, etc.
- D. Consistency in the Literature Cited section is especially important. Each citation should start with the author(s) [in boldface]. Then the title of the article as printed. The bibliographic reference should be in italics followed without punctuation by the volume and page citations, which should be in Roman. The following are a few examples:
