ADDENDA ET CORRIGENDA

- Page 60. *Pleurothallis barbulata*. Remove from synonymy: *Pleurothallis abjecta* Ames and *Pleurothallis ciliilabia* Schltr.
- Page 204. The authority and citation should read: **Pleurothallis racemiflora** Lindl. ex Hook., *Exotic Flora* 2:123. 1824, exclude from syn. *Dendrobium racemiflorum* Sw.
- Page 216. *Acostaea trilobata*. NAPO should read PASTAZA.
- Page 260. *Pleurothallis peduncularis*. Add to synonymy: *Pleurothallis aspasicensis* Rchb. f., *Bonplandia* 3:73. 1855.
- Page 266. *Pleurothallis pruinosa*. Add to synonymy: *Stelis flavida* Focke, *Tijdschr. Natuurk. Wetensch. Kunsten* 2:202. 1849; *Pleurothallis flavida* (Focke) Lindl., *Folia Orchid. Pleuroth.* 44. 1859.
- Page 272. *Pleurothallis revoluta*. Add to synonymy: *Stelis revoluta* (Ruiz & Pav.) Willd., *Spec. Pl.* 4:140. 1805.
- Page 284. *Pleurothallis sclerophylla*. Add to synonymy: *Pleurothallis racemosa* Cogn., *Flora Brasiliensis* 3(4):554. 1896.
- Page 286. *Pleurothallis secunda*. Remove from synonymy: *Pleurothallis bicornis* Lindl., and *Humboldtia bicornis* (Lindl.) Kuntze.
- Page 294. *Pleurothallis spiralis*. Add to synonymy: *Pleurothallis longerepens* Schltr., *Repert. Spec. Nov. Regni Veg. Beih.* 8:129. 1921.
- Page 312. The plant described on page 312 and illustrated on page 313 is *Pleurothallis octomeriae* Schltr. I erred by including it in the synonymy of the Mexican *P. octomerioides* Lindl. which will be described and illustrated in a forthcoming issue. Except for the description of the plant figured, the text on page 312 should be changed accordingly:

***Pleurothallis octomeriae*** Schltr., *Repert. Spec. Nov. Regni Veg. Beih.* 17:21. 1921.

*Pleurothallis cerea* Ames, *Sched. Orchid.* 4:19. 1923.

ETYMOLOGY: Named for the similarity of the species to the genus *Octomeria*. *Octomeria* from the Greek *octo*, "eight," and *meros*, "part," referring to the eight pollinia.

TYPE: PANAMA: CHIRIQUI: epiphytic in ravines, alt. ca. 1700 m, C. W. Powell 252.

DISTRIBUTION: Nicaragua, Costa Rica, and Panama.

This species resembles an *Octomeria* not only because of its habit, but also because the petals are as large as the sepals. *Pleurothallis octomeriae* is closely allied to the Mexican *P. octomerioides* Lindl. Neither has been reported from intervening Guatemala and Honduras. *Pleurothallis octomeriae* may be distinguished from its relative by the short, swollen segments of the rhizome, the glabrous sepals, petals which are generally wider below the middle, and a lip which is minutely verruculose.
